# **CHARTS**

## MAJOR TRAITS OF THE INTROVERT "I":

likes quiet
likes to concentrate without intrusions and interruptions
intensive rather than extensive
may have trouble remembering names and faces
works contentedly alone
enjoys solitary pursuits
may have problems communicating freely
is energized by being alone
is reflective
interested in internal happenings
may be slow to respond to external cues

#### MAJOR TRAITS OF THE EXTRAVERT "E":

likes variety and action
plunges readily into new and untried experiences
good at interacting with a lot of people
communicates freely
often acts quickly, without thinking
interested in external happenings
responds more quickly to external cues

### MAJOR TRAITS OF INTUITIVE TYPES "N":

craves inspiration as the breath of life
wants to constantly change or improve what is
faces life expectantly
imaginative at the expense of observation of details
inventive, innovative, ingenious, and original
works in bursts of energy powered by enthusiasm, with slack
periods in between
reaches conclusions quickly

dislikes taking time for precision work or routine, repetitive chores

patient with complicated situations excited by inner meanings, symbols, ideas, concepts intrigued by fantasies, hunches, speculations and theories always one step ahead, thinking about possibilities enjoys complexity and profundity of thought seeks perfection in the world of ideas and ideals

#### MAJOR TRAITS OF THE THINKING TYPES "T":

values logic above sentiment

responds to words such as: principles, policies, laws, criteria, logic, objectives, justice, categories, standards, analysis

impersonal, more interested in things than human relationships more truthful than tactful

can get along in a non-harmonious environment and may not even be aware of others' distress or hostility

blocks facial expression in a crisis may hurt people without realizing it firm-minded

able to reprimand and criticize more easily than "F" stronger in executive ability than social arts likely to question conclusions

brief and businesslike

good at organizing facts and ideas into a logical sequence tends to suppress, undervalue and ignore feeling intellecutally critical

not easily influenced by outside pressures or views

#### MAJOR TRAITS OF THE FEELING TYPES "F":

values harmony, togetherness, relationships sensitive to emotional climate: aware of people and their feelings

responds to words such as: values, intimacy, sympathy, harmony, devotion, appreciation

enjoys pleasing others and living up to others' expectations

dislikes telling people unpleasant news values sentiment above logic more tactful than truthful stronger in social arts than executive ability naturally friendly; difficulty being brief and business-like may ramble and repeat what has already been said may have difficulty organizing thoughts may suppress, undervalue and ignore logic

#### MAJOR TRAITS OF THE PERCEIVING TYPES "P":

independent, autonomous, and insubordinate

spontaneous: has the ability to wholeheartedly experience the moment even if some intended things go undone

open-minded: is willing to admit to new ideas even if they conflict with one's own

understanding of others and tolerant of other points of view curious and adventurous

zest for experience

adaptability arising from willingness to let go of the old and improvise to meet altered conditions.
